About:

The University of Montreal Department of Orthopaedics offers a 12-month Orthopaedic Sports Medicine Fellowship, starting July 1st of each year. We are currently accepting applications for 2022.

The CHUM Hospital is a tertiary referral center for complex pathologies. Our team specializes in the evaluation and treatment of complex sports medicine cases using a minimally invasive and personalised approach. Our expertise contributes to the education of orthopaedic surgeons seeking advanced sports medicine knowledge with the possibility of exposure in multiple subspecialties, including upper (shoulder-elbow-wrist) and lower (knee-ankle-foot) extremities. The fellowship can be adapted to the specific interests of the candidates.

Fellowship objectives:

1. Achieve clinical competency in the diagnosis, physical examination, imaging, non-surgical and surgical management of sports medicine pathologies
2. Develop surgical expertise in complex surgeries of the upper and lower extremities (arthroscopy, minimally invasive approaches, periarticular reconstruction, sports trauma, revision surgery)
3. Participate in the different aspects of an academic career, including research and teaching responsibilities within the Orthopaedic Sports Medicine Unit at the CHUM

Requirements:

Candidates interested in applying can send their application by email, including a personal statement, CV and 3 letters of reference to the fellowship director at karine.bourduas@umontreal.ca. Applications should be sent at least 12 months in advance of the start date, since the process can take up to a year.
