2025 COA Graduate Snapshot



The Canadian Orthopaedic Association (COA) gathers graduate data from the 17 Canadian orthopaedic training program directors and administrators. Below are the most current statistics reflecting graduates from 2015 to 2024. The numbers reported are from fall 2024.

These insights contribute to planning such as:

- Identifying Trends: Graduate data reveals patterns in employment, specialty choices and geographic distribution. This helps identify areas with shortages or surpluses in the workforce.
- Resource Allocation: By understanding where graduates are practicing, healthcare systems can allocate resources more effectively, ensuring underserved regions and highly populated areas receive the support they need.

- Planning for Future Workforce: Tracking the career paths of graduates helps predict future workforce needs. This information is essential for designing training programs to meet anticipated demand.
- Advocacy for Patient Care: Data showing gaps in the workforce strengthens the case for increased funding, or policy changes to improve access to care.
- Benchmarking and Accountability: comparing graduate outcomes with workforce goals ensures that education programs align with national or regional needs.

QUICK FACTS

From 2015 to 2024 a total of **675 people graduated** from the
17 orthopaedic academic programs in Canada.

As of fall 2024, of the **675 graduates** from 2015 to 2024

- **297** (45%) were employed full time (* includes military)
- **89** (13%) were employed outside Canada (* includes visa trainees)
- 49 (7%) were looking for full time work

As of fall 2024, of the **245 graduates** from 2020-2024, **68** (28%) were employed and **20** (8%) were actively seeking employment.

Reports state that **140 individuals** are in fellowship training programs from 2021-2024, and **48** have entered fellowship in 2024.

The highest number of graduates in Canada was **83** in 2017. Decreases in the number of orthopaedic residency positions in response to the lack of jobs is evident in the years that follow, reaching a low of **57** graduates in 2024.

A total of **123 full-time positions** and **42** part-time/locum positions were listed with the COA Job Board in the last 4 years.

There was **no significant difference** between males and females in the proportion of graduates who had obtained full time employment.


About **23%** of graduates from 2015 to 2024 self-identify as female. The trend has steadily risen over this period of time, from **24%** in 2015 to **37%** in 2024.








MUN is the only orthopaedic Program in Canada to achieve gender parity, reporting an equal number of female and male graduates since 2015.







Since 2021, 245 have graduated in Canada. Eleven of those graduates were from Dalhousie.









From 2021-2024, the majority of graduates from Université de Montréal self-identified as female, making it the institution with the highest number of female graduates in Québec.








From 2021-2024, McGill University reported the highest number of graduates in the region, almost double the other programs in Québec.








From 2021-2024, McMaster reported some of the highest numbers of Year 1 and 2 fellowships in Ontario, for a total of 20 reported to be in training.







Since 2021, 245 have graduated in Canada. Four of those graduates were from NOSM.











From 2015 to 2024, the University of Toronto reported having the highest number of graduates in Canada who self-identified as female.








From 2021 to 2024, University of Ottawa reported a number of graduates entering fellowship programs that was twice the total reported from the combined years 2015 to 2020.








From 2021 to 2024, Western University reported 17 graduates in fellowship training, the third highest reported in Ontario.








University of Manitoba is the only program in the Prairies to achieve gender parity in 2024, reporting an equal number of female and male graduates.








University of Saskatchewan reported the highest percentage of self-identified female graduates in the Prairie region, at 45.5% from 2015 to 2024.






